KITCHEN GARDEN VOLUNTEERS

Enjoy working with fruit, herbs and vegetables?

The Friends offers herb and vegetable gardening experiences from

March to September each year (may be extended beyond these times in the future). This includes traditional plants as well as bush tucker and native plants. Each month



fBBGSA volunteers complete a range of tasks from planting, weeding, potting up, cultivating, composting etc.

THE GROWING FRIENDS VOLLUNTEERS

The Friends meet at Brisbane Botanic Gardens Mt Coot-Tha on a monthly basis to propagate selected species from the gardens. Task covered include selecting stock for propagating; time of year; watering; fertilising; developing types of growing media; potting up cuttings; care when handling, hygiene practices, monitoring systems and recording results. A Growing Friends nursery is planned to be built in 2019 expanding the capacity and the ability to provide sound horticultural maintenance practices.

These are not training programs but group activities to augment the gardens staff in various horticultural programs. Basic horticultural knowledge, ability to use tools unassisted and applying safe and hygienic horticultural practices without supervision are a pre-requisite. Please note that The Friends and the BCC staff do not provide training, care assistance, nor support of any member's needs or endeavours in gardening, to enable participation in this group.
